

# Funded Partnership Initiative

Corrective Services NSW (CSNSW) currently has a number of transitional support services in place, many of which are part of the Funded Partnership Initiative (FPI) managed by FPI Contracts Team.

The FPI commenced on 1 September 2014 and builds on the previous Community Funding Program (CFP) with increased investment in the area of Transitional Support Services.

The FPI provides funding to not-for-profit, non-government organisations to deliver a range of services that support CSNSW’s offender management in three main areas:

- **Transitional Support**
- **Offenders' Children and Families**
- **Victim Support**

Within these three streams, there are programs being run across metropolitan and regional locations.

## Transitional Supported Accommodation (TSA)

Up to 12 weeks' supported accommodation, as well as outreach support following exit from the service. All referrals to the service providers will be via the relevant local Community Corrections office. Beds are dedicated for higher risk offenders who require the type of support provided by individual organisations e.g. AOD focus, women only service, etc.

## Initial Transitional Support (ITS)

Each ITS provider is linked to a Community Corrections location and provides up to 12 weeks' support for higher risk offenders supervised by Community Corrections. The support period can be extended if necessary. The service providers work in collaboration with Community Corrections, with the support directly linked to the offender's case plan to reduce the risk of reoffending. Support services may assist offenders with a range of needs such as accommodation, mental health and alcohol and other drug services.

## Extended Reintegration Service (ERS)

This service is a partnership established by CSNSW, Housing NSW and Mental Health Services, South Western Sydney Local Health District, previously known as the Parolee Support Initiative.

ERS provides housing and support services to offenders with significant complex needs: mental health, alcohol/other drug issues and/or cognitive impairment or borderline intellectual disability. All offenders must also be homeless or at risk of homelessness. All agencies, including the service providers work in partnership to provide 12 months' support, which includes up to 3 months' pre-release engagement and up to 9 months' post release support.

## Inmate Property Service (IPS)

Eligible inmates can have their property items stored while they are in custody. The property must be collected within three months of release or it will be disposed of.

## Family, Friends & Children's Visitor Support Service

The Family, Friends and Children's Visitor Support Service is provided at several metropolitan and regional Correctional Centres. The service includes supporting children during visits and facilitating Child/Parent Activity Days, which enable children to have a higher quality visit with the inmate-parent.

## Contact Coordination and Support Service

This service provides a flexible and responsive service to assist people in maintaining contact with a loved one in custody. This service includes brokerage funds to support families, friends and children in maintaining contact and also provides advocacy and general assistance to the target group. Family casework and referral services are also provided.

## Victim Impact and Risk Management Seminars

This service provides information to lower risk inmates on the following:

- Criminogenic risk management strategies;
- The impact of offending on victims of crime and the community;
- Re-entry / support services to assist with the transition from custody to the community in order to contribute towards community safety.

The service provider develops and delivers innovative, flexible and professional service targeting risk management, impact (understanding the effects of crime on direct and indirect victims) and support (linking to appropriate services to mitigate the likelihood of further re-offending).
