Attorney General’s rates for Legal Representation

as at 1 August 2023

The Attorney General’s rates

The Attorney General's rates for legal representation (also referred to as AG’s rates or Attorney's rates) are rates set by the Attorney General which are payable to legal representatives (Solicitors, Junior and Senior Counsel) engaged by and on behalf of Government departments and agencies. Agencies can negotiate lower rates where appropriate, having regard to the matter, the experience of the practitioner/counsel and the need to keep legal costs to government reasonable.

In respect of the briefing of Senior Counsel by all government departments and agencies, the AG’s rates apply (see [C2018-06](#)) unless approval has been granted by the Attorney General to apply higher rates.

When do the Attorney General’s rates apply?

The AG’s rates apply to Senior Counsel approved under and in accordance with [C2018-06](#).

In respect of Junior Counsel and Solicitors, the rates apply to matters such as:

- ex gratia representation as approved by the Attorney General under [M2022-10](#); and
- costs associated with certificates under the *Suitor’s Fund Act 1951* and with the *Costs in Criminal Cases Act 1967*.

The AG's rates include all overheads, secretarial, legal and administrative assistance but not out of pocket disbursements and are GST exclusive.

What are the current Attorney’s rates?

The current rates, effective from 1 August 2023 are:

	Rate
Solicitor	\$315.40 per hour with a daily maximum of \$3,154 plus GST
Junior Counsel	\$315.40 per hour with a daily maximum of \$2,365 plus GST
Senior Counsel	\$521.74 per hour with a daily maximum of \$5,217 plus GST

- The daily maximum for Solicitors and Senior Counsel is based on a 10 hour day.
- The daily maximum for Junior Counsel is based on a 7.5 hour day.

- There is no entitlement to the maximum daily rate.

The Attorney's rates will next be reviewed in August 2024.

Do the AG's rates apply to Panel firms?

Where external legal representatives are engaged under the NSW Government Legal Services Panel, the Treasury Managed Fund Panel, or any other NSW government legal panel arrangement, rates that have been set under the relevant panel agreements apply.

Do the AG's rates apply to the Crown Solicitor?

The AG's rates for Solicitors do not apply to the Crown Solicitor or the Crown Solicitor's Office.
